Boundary Commission Review Update



The Boundary Commission for England has now concluded its consultation into the ward boundaries for elections to EHDC, and its findings have been confirmed by Parliament, so with effect from the May 2019 local elections, the Liss Ward will be expanded to include all of Liss Forest.

The Liss Ward will continue to be represented by two councillors at East Hampshire District Council.

The boundaries for parliamentary constituencies, Hampshire County Council divisions and parish councils are unaffected by this decision.

Changes to Bus Service 38



Following a major consultation earlier this year, Hampshire County Council has decided to reduce funding for the 38 bus service from Petersfield to Liss, Greatham and Alton.

As a result, there will be a reduction in service from 7 services in each direction per day to 5 services in each direction per day. Services will continue to run every day Monday to Friday (excluding bank holidays).

New timetables will be made available ahead of the service changes which are expected to be introduced in January 2019.

Liss in Bloom

Heart Defibrillators In Liss

We are incredibly lucky to have the Liss Heart Trust in our village. Funded entirely by donations, the Liss Heart Trust started as a campaign by a village GP to provide a defibrillator in the village.

Thanks to the continued effort of the Liss Heart Trust and its band of volunteers we now have 12 defibrillators in locations around the village.

Ground over the last few months you can be in little doubt that the new Liss Pavilion is now taking shape.

In the last two weeks, the huge Gualam beams that form the structure of the main hall have been craned into place roof timbers completed, ready for the roofing itself to be put in place, the full scale of the new pavilion is becoming apparent.

We are very pleased that the pavilion build is very much on schedule and also currently within the budget allowed for the project.

We are extremely grateful to all Liss residents who have given support to the new pavilion scheme, from those who gave £5 to buy a brick to those who took the time to respond to our consultation and gave us a clear mandate to proceed with a loan from the Public Works Loans Board, which together with existing reserves and developer's contributions enabled us to fully fund the project.

for the main hall and equipment for the changing rooms, right down to cups, saucers and teaspoons.

The new pavilion has been designed from the outset to serve as many functions as possible, so while we have had close liaison with the 1st Liss Scouts to ensure their needs are catered for, we have also ensured that facilities for football, social events and corporate presentations are all available.

The main hall will have a seating capacity of 128 (in 'theatre' format) or 100 for banquet style seating. The hall will have kitchen facilities to allow the heating of food and beverages and a small quiet

Externally, there will be a decking area to allow spectators to watch activity on the football pitches and recreation ground. There will be access from the kitchen to the decking allowing for refreshments to be served to spectators.

Liss Remembers

Remembrance Sunday is always an important day in the village calendar, and especially this year when it falls on November 11th and commemorates 100 years since the end of World War One.

In addition to the parade through the village led by the Liss Branch of the Royal British Legion, this year a tree has been planted in the Memorial Gardens at Newman Collard Playing Fields. We thank Hilliers Nursery for kindly donating the tree.

Please do pop along to the Memorial Gardens and view the new tree - at the going down of the sun, and in the morning, we will remember them.

The hearings take place at the South Downs Centre, Midhurst from Tuesday 13th November until Thursday 15th November and from Tuesday 4th December until Thursday 6th December. Members of the public are welcome to attend on any day(s) of the public examination.

Extensions to 30mph speed limit



Drivers please note that the area of the village covered by a 30mph speed limit is being extended and as we go to press, new signs are being erected.

The new limits see 30mph extended further along Rake Road, Mill Road, Farnham Road and the whole length of Hill Brow Road from the Jolly Drover Junction to the roundabout in the centre of the village.

We would also take this opportunity to remind all drivers that 30mph is a limit and not a target, please drive according to traffic and road conditions, taking special care where there are pedestrians and cyclists.

Please trim your hedge
Please take advantage of the cool autumn weather to trim your hedge, especially if your hedge grows out over a pavement and/or is near a road junction. It is important to trim your hedge in either the autumn or the winter so that you do not disturb any nesting birds who may have made their home in your hedge during the spring and early summer.

Clean up after your dog

We have many areas within Liss and Liss Forest where dog owners can walk their dog. We want to encourage dog walking, but please walk your dog responsibly - pick up its poo in a bag and take the bag home with you or put it in one of the bins provided. Please do not just leave your full poo bag hanging from a branch or laying on the ground. We will shortly be installing poo bag dispensers at West Liss and Newman Collard playing fields. Liss Forest Residents Association have provided poo bags at Liss Forest recreation ground.
